		Track and Trace: The Ground secretary has been tasked with ensuring that all	
		volunteers have been logged regarding Covid-19 symptom awareness	
		Similarly the Team Manager has been given similar logs for training sessions. Both have

		Footballs: The system for footballs outside the playing area (Ball transfer) is that	
		spectators will be advised not to throw the balls back. Several balls will be placed	
		around the ground players take one of the 'clean' balls while a Stewards wipes down the	

'out' ball. The players should be re-educated into the system for balls and assisting the kit man

Seating: We have tried various ways to make seating easily accessible for groups and singles with removable red crosses at the Twigg stand. Currently the front row of the Twigg stand are allocated to players from both teams and are identified as such. Players should clear these areas on completion of the game.

Behind this where practicable we will keep maintain social distancing between spectators with 'movable' do not sit signs. Seating is to be controlled by Stewards We are currently reviewing the wearing of face coverings so that seating can be one seat apart.

The Cyril Harris stand has seating areas identified not for use by red tape **Stewards:** Existing Stewards who have been with the Club a long time have been advised of the need to 'multi task'. They should continually be aware of social distancing and 'challenge' spectators to make them aware in a most polite manner. Stewards briefing will take place on match days at given times by the Safety Officer and will include social distancing awareness for spectators

Hand Gel/Signs: There are Hand Gel stations all around the Ground. The Ground Secretary will ensure they are full for match days. Posters one way systems etc are situated around the ground to remind spectators/Visitors of social distancing

Visiting Directors/Sponsors: The Social Club Coordinator will ensure that visiting Directors and Sponsors are sat in the specified areas and complying with social distancing measures

Tunnel: According to current guidelines the tunnel area can be used as stated in section 7&8 of the Ground Guidance RA. The one change is that the Tunnel is to spray cleaned before and after each fixture with teams staggering entrance with the match officials being aware and are in agreement with this guide and system
